

WHAT PARTICIPATION CRITERIA DO I NEED TO FULLFILL?

In order to guarantee the integrity of UCLG, all potential private partners would need to respect the following criteria:

- > Support the objectives and missions of UCLG;
- > Support the **Principles of the UN Global Compact**;
- > Offer expertise in areas that contribute to the overall mission of UCLG in order to strengthen and promote cities as centres for decision-making and governance;
- > Be willing to work according to the **terms of reference established by the UCLG Executive Bureau**;
- > Be willing to reinforce UCLG's continuing commitment to enhancing the quality and professionalism of local government;
- > Be willing to agree on a **corporate code of ethics**, that should include:
 1. Be dedicated to the **concepts of democratic local government** by responsible elected officials and believe that professional management is essential to achieving these goals;
 2. **Affirm the dignity and worth of the services** rendered by government and maintain a constructive, creative, and practical attitude toward local government affairs;
 3. **Be dedicated to the highest ideals of honour and integrity** in all facets of the relationship, so that the partners merit the respect and confidence of members of the corporate organization and members of UCLG, local government elected officials and employees, and the public;
 4. **Encourage communication and participation in information-sharing** among the private sector, local government, and the public;
 5. **Refrain from competing**, either directly or indirectly, **with the programmes or services offered by UCLG**, its Regional Sections or Committees.

A new era for local democracy

United Cities and Local Governments (UCLG) represents and defends the interests of local governments on the world stage. Headquartered in Barcelona, the organisation's stated mission is to be the united voice and world advocate of democratic local self-government, promoting its values, objectives and interests, through cooperation between local governments, and within the wider international community.



UCLG Objectives

- > Increasing the role and influence of local government and its representative organisations in global governance;
- > Becoming the main source of intelligence, best practices and support for democratic, effective, innovative local government close to the citizen;
- > Ensuring an effective and democratic global organisation.

UCLG has access to the biggest network of local and regional governments in the world

- > UCLG's members represent over half of the world's total population;
- > Present in 140 of the 192 United-Nations member states in seven world regions, UCLG's members include individual cities and national associations of local governments which represent all the cities and local governments in a single country;
- > Over 1000 cities across 95 countries are direct members of UCLG;
- > 112 Local Governments Associations (LGAs) are members of UCLG, representing almost every existing LGA in the world. Europe boasts the largest number of LGAs, which represent around 80% of the total European population.



The executive bureau has 115 seats and the world council 341 seats from 140 different countries

The UCLG Presidency is composed of one President and 5 Co-presidents, coming from different world-regions. There is also an elected Treasurer that holds the political responsibility over the finances of the World Organization together with a multicultural committee of over 25 members from around the world.
